Your teen, being formed as a disciple of Jesus by you as well as through our curriculum, is one of the most precious gifts you will receive.

You and we are called to protect the life and dignity of the children entrusted to us. You and we are called to give special attention to the most vulnerable among us. Together we are charged with caring for all that God has created.

Because we believe so strongly in the importance of being faithful to this call, we take special steps to make sure our children are aware of what it means to create a safe environment for themselves.

Safe environment education is not education for human and sexual development. It is rather an effort to train young people to recognize when adults or others behave in an inappropriate manner toward them, how to resist, and to report any and all attempts.

Age appropriate information is integrated into religious education topics taught at each grade level. The curricular points covered in your teen's class are listed below. We encourage you to discuss these points with your child. Parents are primary educators of their children and studies have shown that children listen when parents take the time to talk with their children.

- To increase one's understanding of how the Cardinal/Moral Virtues of Prudence, Justice, Fortitude and Temperance are part of good decision making.
- Recognize that each person is a unique gift of God deserving of respect and dignity.
- Name behaviors or situations that make a teen feel uncomfortable and unsafe.
- Learn to avoid dangers and, when not possible, to resist seductions, withstand peer pressure and demonstrate care for others.
- Build on personal strengths so as to enhance the ability to resist temptation or more aggressive efforts to engage the teen in inappropriate activity.

Parent Follow Up

- Name situations where your teen is uncomfortable and discuss ways to handle it.
- Ask when your teen feels peer pressure or feels left out and discuss ways to overcome it.
- Discuss why you need to monitor your teen's social media.
